The registry is a database of information about Veterans collected through a questionnaire.

OEF/OIF/OND or 1990-1991 Gulf War Veterans and can use the registry questionnaire to report exposures to airborne hazards (such as smoke from burn pits, oil-well fires, or pollution during deployment), as well as other \bullet exposures and health concerns.

- Create a snapshot from which to identify changes in your health.
- Print and use your completed questionnaire to discuss concerns with your provider.
- Learn about follow-up care and VA benefits.
- Instructions are available if you need assistance with the questionnaire.
