Commander's Message



Recruiting is still highest on the list of concerns of the state of Virginia VFW. This was apparent at the District 8 meeting which our Post hosted in late September. Mike Boehme, the state VFW Senior Vice Commander and our own Rick Raskin, the state Judge Advocate, shared duties as they put on a compelling power point show. It is no surprise that VFW membership is dropping in Virginia (33,249 in 2012, 32,767 in 2016) but some of the other statistical facts stay with you:

There are about 824,000 veterans in Virginia and 55 percent of them are eligible to join the VFW. It does not take a mathematician to figure out there are a lot of potential VFW members out there who could be recruited.

involved in important projects and promotes a sense of trust among all members and keeps all members involved in what is going on at the Post.

At Post 7589 we did a good job of recruiting last year but the challenges for this year are already popping up. We have 3 great opportunities in the next two months to recruit new members and retain the older members. On a date to be announced in October we will have a phone calling night where the Post will provide pizza and we will call members who have not renewed. On October 1st we will have a booth at the Manassas Fall Jubilee, often a recruiting gold mine as the pressure is off and you can engage potential members in relaxed conversation about VFW membership. Finally, the Buddy Poppy drives of Veteran's Day weekend (11/11 - 11/13) offer another opportunity to talk in a relaxed, non -pressure situation to potential VFW members. Mike Boehme surprised me when he said studies show that the majority of successful VFW recruiting is done informally. In other words, your neighbor, relative or co-worker who is a veteran but is not a VFW member can be recruited. More members are recruited "informally" than at VFW recruiting booths, etc. We all need to get to work and spread the word about what a great veterans organization the VFW is.

The VFW has 20 percent of the Vietnam combat veterans but only 5 percent of the post 9-11 combat veterans.

The VFW has only 5 percent of the eligible female veterans.

The conclusion is easy to reach. We have to do a better job of getting new members and they are out there.

We also have to do a members we have. The bers at the District meeting on September 18. old "out the back door"

route is one of the VFW's biggest challenges.

The Boehme/Raskin team presented other interesting facts:

The top 7 reasons our members leave the VFW:

- 1. Disorganized Post Leadership
- 2. Inadequate Orientation of new members
- 3. Lack of friends at the Post
- 4. Lack of recognition
- 5. Lack of Growth
- 6. Lack of important programs
- 7. Not listening to what younger members want

The same survey showed VFW members will stay if the Post is Pete MacLeod well organized, financially stable, has a direction and purpose, is

Diaries of Pershing, Patton Now Online

The Library of Congress Gazette September 23, 2016

The Library of Congress recently placed online the diaries, notebooks and address books of John J. Pershing, commander-in -chief of the American Expeditionary Forces in World War I, and the diaries of George S. Patton, a tank commander in World War I and a U.S. Army general in World War II.

These items join thousands of original materials from the World War I era that the Library has digitized and made accessible for use, ahead of the April 2017 centennial of America's entry into the Great War.



Pershing's digitized diaries, notebooks and address books describe his command of the American Expeditionary Forces in France during World War I and his postwar service as Army chief of staff until 1925. Patton's diaries, 1910-1945, illustrate his activities during the Mexican Punitive Expedition, World War I and World War II.

The entire collection of Pershing papers spans the years 1882-1971, with the bulk of the material concentrated in the period 1904

-1948. It consists of correspondence, diaries, notebooks, speeches, statements, writings, orders, maps, scrapbooks, newspaper clippings, picture albums, posters, photographs, printed matter and memorabilia.



The entire collection of Patton's papers spans the years 1807-1979, with the bulk of the papers concentrated from 1904-1945. The collection documents Patton's military career, including his attendance at the U.S. Military Academy at West Point; his service on the Mexican border as a member of Pershing's Mexican Punitive Expedition; his service as an aide-decamp to Pershing and papers spans the years 1882-1971, with later as a tank commander in World War I. The majority of

the papers chronicle Patton's World War II service.

On April 4, the Library will open a major exhibition, "Echoes of the Great War: American Experiences of World War !," to commemorate the centennial of the United States' entry into the Great War. It will close in January 2019.
