Sport Clips Haircuts Launches Annual 'Help A Hero' Campaign to Raise \$1.5 Million for Veteran Scholarships through Nov. 16

Now the largest scholarship program of its kind, Help A Hero supports service members pursuing education needed for civilian careers

GEORGETOWN, Texas (Oct. 9, 2024) – Sport Clips Haircuts has launched its annual "Help A Hero" campaign to raise \$1.5 million through November 16, in support of the VFW's "Sport Clips Help A Hero Scholarship" program. The campaign funds scholarships for veterans and service members making the transition from military to civilian careers, with 100 percent of donations going toward education funding.

Today through Veterans Day, donations to the program can be made at checkout when clients come in for a haircare service. Donations can also be made <u>online</u>, or via a new, easier option to text "HEROVFW" to 53555. On Veterans Day, participating Sport Clips locations will also donate \$2 from every paid haircut

service, and many will offer free haircuts to veterans and active-duty military.

Founded in 2013 in response to the increasing need for veteran education assistance beyond GI Bill benefits, the Sport Clips VFW Help A Hero Scholarship program has grown to become the largest of its kind. Spearheaded by Sport Clips Founder and Air Force veteran Gordon Logan, the initiative has already provided more than 3,000 scholarships totaling nearly \$14 million for veterans seeking post-military education.

"Our stylists and clients are at the heart of this initiative with eighty percent of our annual donations coming from our generous clients," said Logan. "It's an honor to support those who have served our country as part of our commitment to thank our nation's heroes and give back to the military community."

"Surveys show the major challenges for veterans transitioning out of their military careers and stepping back into civilian life are finding a job, parting ways with their friends in the military and finding a purposeful career. One in five veterans says a lack of funds has prevented them from pursuing their educational goals," said VFW National Commander Al Lipphardt. "So, getting a haircut and making a donation is a simple but powerful way to help veterans succeed."

Help A Hero scholarships provide up to \$5,000 per semester to help cover tuition and fees. Veterans from all branches with a rank of E-5 and below are eligible, with funds sent directly to the educational institution of their choice. Risky business: offers to cash out your home equity through a "sale-leaseback"

Have you seen offers to "unlock" the equity in your home by selling it and then renting it back from the buyer? The ads make these agreements — called sale-leasebacks — sound like a simple and risk-free way to get cash upfront and stay in your home. But the truth is these agreements are far from risk-free.

When you agree to a sale-leaseback, you're selling your home and becoming a renter. The risks — often hidden in the fine print of complicated contracts — include hefty fees, exorbitant rent, and even eviction from your home if you can't afford to pay the rent when it goes up. (And it often does.)

If you're considering a sale-leaseback, here's some advice:

- Take your time. If a buyer pressures you to act immediately, walk away. Selling your home is an important decision. Anyone who rushes you doesn't have your best interests at heart.
- Read the fine print. If your agreement is different from what the buyer promised or is too complicated to understand, stop.
- Hire a lawyer or involve a trusted family member or friend. Home sales contracts are often complex. Hire a lawyer or ask a trusted person to help you review the documents and understand the contract terms.

Know the risks. If you go through with a sale-leaseback agreement, you won't own your home anymore. That means you could be forced to leave your home if, for example, you can't afford to pay the rent.

Before you borrow against your home or respond to a saleleaseback offer, <u>learn more</u> from the FTC. And if you experience a problem or scam, tell the FTC at <u>ReportFraud.ftc.gov</u>.

VFW Magazine to resume printed editions

Changes become effective in January 2025

A couple of years ago, the National Council of Administration voted to change how often we print the magazine and to start moving to a virtual version. This opened the door to more ad options and reduced printing costs. However, roughly 100,000 members asked to keep getting all of the editions and our new pricing model was thrown totally out of whack. We also lost ad revenue from four companies totaling nearly \$250,000 because of the way we were moving and the smaller audience that were seeing their ads.

While we are seeing some savings, we must reign this in further and capture the ad revenue we know we can get. To that end, we will move to a new model. There will be six printed editions of the magazine annually sent to our members. There will also be a website managed by our staff with additional content different from what you see in the magazine. This allows us to secure printing and postage prices and maximize readership to increase ad revenue. This will change beginning in January of 2025. [Virginia's National Council member Ken Wiseman] seconded the motion and voted to support the change.

Proposed Constitutional Amendment

ARTICLE X. Taxation and Finance.

Section 6-A. Property tax exemption for; certain veterans and their surviving spouses and; surviving spouses of soldiers killed in action **who died in the line of duty**.

BALLOT QUESTION

Should the Constitution of Virginia be amended so that the tax exemption that is currently available to the surviving spouses of soldiers killed in action is also available to the surviving spouses of soldiers who died in the line of duty?

EXPLANATION FOR VOTERS

Present Law

Generally, the Virginia Constitution requires that all property be taxed. It also sets out specific types of property that may be exempted from taxation. Currently, the Virginia Constitution allows the General Assembly to exempt from taxation the principal place of residence of the surviving spouse of any soldier who is determined by the U.S. Department of Defense to have been killed in action.

Proposed Amendment

The proposed amendment would expand this current tax exemption so that it is available to all surviving spouses of soldiers who are determined by the U.S. Department of Defense to have died in the line of duty, including those who have been killed in action.


A "yes" vote would allow the surviving spouse of a soldier who died in the line of duty to claim the same real property tax exemption on their principal place of residence that is currently only available to the surviving spouses of soldiers who are killed in action.

Joint Leadership Council of VSOs

This initiative was passed by the General Assembly with the added caveat that localities could exempt themselves. A constitutional amendment, if passed, would require that all localities adhere to the regulation. The JLC **strongly** supports this amendment.

DON'T FEED THE SHARKS

VFW submitted its fourth Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request to VA requesting documentation about unaccredited companies that provide services to claimants seeking VA benefits. We have received two interim responses from VA to date on this request and anticipate additional responses to be forthcoming. Among the documents provided is a letter sent to a company called REE Medical, dated January 4, 2024, in which VA points out that REE Medical is prohibited from assisting in the "preparation, presentation, or prosecution of VA benefits claims." VA requested a response from REE Medical within 30-days of receipt of the letter to address the concerns raised in the letter. No response was provided in the documents received.






The Freedom Museum interprets the struggle to protect our nation's freedom through the
