

Honoring the fallen at the Normandy American Cemetery

Rick Raskin sprinkles Virginia soil on the grave of Jerry Martin's uncle, Paul M. Kennedy.

The Normandy American Cemetery and Memorial in France is located in Colleville-sur-Mer, on the site of the temporary American St. Laurent Cemetery, established by the U.S. First Army on June 8, 1944 as the first American cemetery on European soil in World War II.

The cemetery contains the graves of 9,389 of our military dead, most of whom lost their lives in the D-Day landings and ensuing operations.

The memorial consists of a semicircular colonnade with a loggia at each end containing large maps and narratives of the military operations; at the center is the bronze statue, "Spirit of American Youth Rising from the Waves."; beyond is the burial area with a circular chapel and, at the far end, granite statues representing the United States and France.

On October 7, Rick Raskin and another veteran were honored to present a wreath at the memorial during a solemn ceremony. Following the ceremony Rick was privileged to sprinkle some Virginia soil on the grave of Comrade Jerry Martin's family member, Paul M. Kennedy.

Just visiting the cemetery and Omaha Beach was a moving experience, one that will not soon be forgotten.

In support of the State Commander's effort to help those affected by the shutdown and with his endorsement, I am sending out information for your use. I ask that you share this with all veterans and military personnel and on your Post's social media.

First, VA is mostly open for business and has many services still available. ... I want to reinforce that the following continue without pause <u>BECAUSE THE VFW FOUGHT TO GET THEM FUNDED WHEN SHUTDOWNS HAPPENS:</u>

- 1. The Veterans Crises Line (Dial 988, Press 1) continue.
- 2. Suicide prevention programs continue.
- 3. Monthly disability checks, GI Bill checks, pension checks, widow/widower checks, and housing benefits get paid.
- 4. VA healthcare, including hospitals and clinics and Vet Centers, continue (make your appointments!).
- 5. Homeless veteran services continue.
- 6. Caregiver support continues.
- 7. The VA's primary 24-7 call center (1-800-MyVA411) is open.
- 8. The Board of Veterans Appeals is processing cases.
- 9. VA claims will be accepted and processed.

The VA's cemetery system continues with burials and paperwork.

Also, those who have Navy Federal Credit Union <u>may</u> qualify for the financial assistance program they have. It replaces most of a regular paycheck with a <u>0% loan</u>. The details can be found here:

I encourage you to consider how you will use your Relief Funds. Supporting veterans, service members, and their families, is allowed when they are in need. This is exactly what "need" is about

The State Commander spoke about "the kind of leadership and compassion we must be ready to demonstrate again". This is how we do it

No one else did what we did the last time this happened. I remember paying electric bills and buying Wal-Mart gift cards for those in need. I remember calling landlords to ask for consideration on the rent. I remember Posts giving thousands of dollars for food, diapers, toilet paper, and hosting dinners along with \$15,000 spent by State HQs covering major bills. I also remember hearing how the VFW was the only VSO doing what we did.

The coming days will be another chance for us to act boldly in support of our reason for existence. This is a philosophical and moral moment for us, but it is also just another day.

Why?

Because we are the VFW. We believe that "Every Day is Veterans Day" and "No One Does More for Veterans".

Comrades,

I sent out emails to members whose memberships have expired asking them to renew and reminding them of the mission of the VFW.

Many of the responses I received were deeply disheartening. One message read, "I cannot renew my membership and support the VFW's salute to LGBTQ. I will not honor, nor promote that mission." Unfortunately, this wasn't an isolated comment, several others expressed similar sentiments,

reflecting broader disagreements with certain aspects of the organization's direction.

Like all of you, I don't agree with every single stance or decision made by any group, and that's okay. What matters most to me is the core mission of the VFW: serving veterans, advocating for their needs, and honoring their service.

When you meet someone, recognize them first and foremost as a veteran. If they happen to be gay, lesbian, Jewish, Christian, Arab, Democrat, Republican, or hold views different from your own, that doesn't diminish the respect owed to their service. We won't always agree, and that's part of being human. But those differences should never prevent us from standing together for the greater good. The vast majority of us (99 percent) already live by this principle. But it's important to express it clearly to the remaining one percent, even if doing so risks losing a member.

I support the VFW because I believe in the work we do, the programs we run, the support we offer, and the community we build. Don't let one disagreement overshadow the impact we make. Unity doesn't require uniformity, it requires respect.

VFW to Washington Post - Veterans' Disability Benefits are Not Charity

The following letter from the VFW National Commander was submitted to The Washington Post

To the Editors of The Washington Post,

Your recent article, "How some veterans exploit \$193 billion VA program, due to lax controls" (October 2025), is not just a disservice to veterans — it is a dangerously misleading piece that feeds into damaging stereotypes and ignores both the moral and legal foundations of the Department of Veterans Affairs disability system.

Let's be absolutely clear: veterans' disability benefits are not charity. They are compensation owed for injuries and conditions incurred in the line of duty — promised by a government that asked men and women to risk their lives and health, often irreversibly, on its behalf. These benefits are not some "loopholes" for opportunists to exploit; they are the very least this country can do for the people it sent to war repeatedly, especially after more than two decades of sustained conflict without a draft.

Your article leans heavily on inflammatory anecdotes and edge cases, portraying veterans as system abusers, while ignoring the structural reality: combat wounds are not the only occupational hazards of military service. The daily grind of service — exposure to toxic environments, repeated concussions, sleep deprivation, moral injury, sexual trauma, constant stress, and grueling physical demands — leaves lasting scars. Just because a veteran wasn't blown up by an IED doesn't mean they aren't disabled.

Invisible injuries like PTSD, traumatic brain injury, and toxic exposure-related illnesses are not "new" or suspect; we just finally stopped ignoring them. Every generation of veterans before this one suffered in silence, and many died without care or acknowledgment. To now say that recognizing these conditions is proof of fraud is not only illogical — it is cruel.

The article also seems to misunderstand how VA disability ratings work. The system doesn't compensate based solely on whether someone can work. It compensates based on how a service-connected condition impairs a veteran's average ability to function in life and society. The fact that a veteran can hold a job doesn't mean their disability doesn't make daily life harder, more painful, or more isolating. If VA ratings were based solely on complete incapacity, we wouldn't see skyrocketing rates of veteran suicide, addiction, homelessness, or divorce — all of which are fueled not by fraud, but by the very real and too often dismissed cost of military service.

Lastly, let's not ignore what this article really reflects: veterans make an easy scapegoat for the elites of this country. We're a small percentage of the population. Many Americans are disconnected from the wars they authorized or ignored. It is politically and socially convenient to question the integrity of veterans ra-

ther than confront the true cost of 25 years of war. But the cost is real. And the obligation to those who bore it is not optional.

If your investigative team wants to find waste and fraud, start with the contractors who overbill, the generals who fail upward, the executives of squandered programs, or the politicians who wave flags while gutting oversight. But don't you dare turn on America's sons and daughters who carried the burden of service and now ask only for the care and compensation they were promised.

We veterans kept our end of the agreement and will continue to demand that those who asked us to defend our nation do the same. **Honor The Contract**.




